## *The Weather*

Rainfall for the period as reported at Houston's Intercontinental Airport was 21.07 inches or 5.22 inches above normal. Eleven inches of that rain fell between 15 Oct and 18 Oct with flooding present over much of the area.

A strong front that passed on the evening of 27 Oct created a series of great birds found on 28 Oct. This included Le Conte's, Nelson's Sharp-tailed and Grasshopper Sparrows on the rocks of the Quintana Jetty, *Brazoria*. And a McCown's Longspur was found along the dunes near the base of the jetty. Other out-of-place birds that day included a Sage Thrasher at Brazoria NWR, *Brazoria* along with a Mountain Plover from Bolivar Flats, *Galveston*.

## *The Best of the Rest*

**Greater White-fronted Goose** *Anser albifrons* A group of 13 seen 17 Sep flying over Beaumont's Cattail Marsh during the annual *Jefferson* fall migration count were the 2<sup>nd</sup> earliest ever for the UTC (John Haynes).  
**Surf Scoter** *Melanitta perspicillata* Early Surfs were found 20 Oct along the Bolivar Peninsula, *Galveston* (Jim Stevenson) and 29 Oct on Pelican Island, *Galveston* (Ted Eubanks).  
**Least Grebe** *Tachybaptus dominicus* The only report was of one 24 Nov at Brazos Bend SP, *Fort Bend* (Johnnie Greene).  
**Horned Grebe** *Podiceps auritus* Two were found 17 Nov along the Bolivar Peninsula, *Galveston* (Mike Austin) and another was seen 25 Nov at Anahuac NWR, *Chambers* (Ken Hartman).  
**Masked Booby** *Sula dactylatra* One was recovered 10 Aug from East Beach, *Galveston* (Barbara House).  
**Northern Gannet** *Morus bassanus* One was recovered from *Galveston* on 18 Aug (Barbara House).

**Magnificent Frigatebird** *Fregata magnificens* The last report was of one seen 10 Nov from the Bolivar Ferry, *Galveston* (Winnie Burkett).

**American Bittern** *Botaurus lentiginosus* The first fall bird was reported 2 Sep from Brazoria NWR, *Brazoria* (Mark Bartosik).

**Glossy Ibis** *Plegadis falcinellus* The usual few birds were reported from Anahuac NWR, *Chambers* (Cin-Ty Lee, Ken Hartman).

**Wood Stork** *Mycteria americana* Two seen 7 Nov at Smith Point, *Chambers* were late (Joe Kennedy).

**Osprey** *Pandion haliaetus* A count of 12 on 11 Oct was the highest ever one-day count at the Smith Point Hawk Watch. The seasonal total of 93 there was also a record (SPHW staff).

**Bald Eagle** *Haliaeetus leucocephalus* A count of 4 on 28 Oct was the highest ever one-day count at the Smith Point Hawk Watch. The seasonal total of 7 there tied a record (SPHW staff).

**Harris's Hawk** *Parabuteo unicinctus* Last winter's impressive invasion was followed up with numerous fall records including 3 found 7 Sep at Galveston Island SP (James Kessler), one seen 10 Nov at Brazoria NWR, *Brazoria* (Carey Jensen), one photographed 11 Nov at Jones Creek, *Brazoria* (Bill Duke) and 2 seen 12 Nov at San Bernard NWR, *Brazoria* (Ron Weeks). This was in addition to numerous records of an unknown number of individuals (four on the official tally) from 15 Sep-28 Oct at Smith Point, *Chambers* (SPHW staff).

**White-tailed Hawk** *Buteo albicaudatus* Not surprisingly this species is being seen with increasing frequency east of Galveston Bay in *Galveston* (Winnie Burkett, Ted Eubanks).

**Golden Eagle** *Aquila chrysaetos* An immature photographed 20 Oct at Smith Point, *Chambers* was the 3<sup>rd</sup> earliest ever for the UTC (Joe Kennedy, SPHW staff). Another was seen 11 Nov in w. *Jefferson* during a Golden Triangle Audubon field trip (John Whittle et al).

**Peregrine Falcon** *Falco peregrinus* One at Smith Point, *Chambers* 17 Aug was a new count early (SPHW staff).

**Piping Plover** *Charadrius melodus* A 12 Aug count of 140 at Bolivar Flats, *Galveston* was encouraging and highlights the early migration window of the species (Cin-Ty Lee).

**Mountain Plover** *Charadrius montanus* One found and photographed 28 Oct at Bolivar Flats, *Galveston* was a rare coastal find and the earliest ever fall record (Winnie Burkett, ph. Bruce Alfredson, et al)

**Whimbrel** *Numenius phaeopus* One seen 17 Nov on Follett's Island, *Brazoria* was late (Dick Peake).

**Wilson's Phalarope** *Phalaropus tricolor* A 12 Aug count of 700 birds at Pelican Island, *Galveston* was impressive (Cin-Ty Lee).

**Red Phalarope** *Phalaropus fulicarius* One was found in a flooded field in western *Jefferson* during an 18 Nov Golden Crescent Audubon field trip (Steve Mayes et al). It was seen by others over the next three days (Joe Kennedy et al). Pending acceptance by the TBRC.

**Parasitic Jaeger** *Stercorarius parasiticus* One was seen 25 Nov following a shrimp boat near Bolivar Flats, *Galveston* (Ted Eubanks).

**California Gull** *Larus californicus* A first cycle bird was seen 17 Nov at Bolivar Flats, *Galveston* (Mike Austin).

**Lesser Black-backed Gull** *Larus fuscus* One found 2 Oct at Surfside, *Brazoria* was early (Stephan Lorenz).

**Black-legged Kittiwake** *Rissa tridactyla* A first-winter bird seen 12 Nov at San Bernard NWR, *Brazoria* was the 3<sup>rd</sup> earliest fall record for the UTC (Ron Weeks). Pending acceptance by the TBRC.

**Black Tern** *Chlidonias niger* Several late birds were seen at Brazoria NWR, *Brazoria* on 6 Nov (Dick Peake).

**Black-billed Cuckoo** *Coccyzus erythrophthalmus* One seen 24 Oct at Smith Point, *Chambers* (Heidi Trudell) and another seen 29 Oct at High Island, *Galveston* were late (Don Verser).

**Burrowing Owl** *Athene cunicularia* One was found at Brazoria NWR, *Brazoria* but the date has not yet been obtained (Keith Ramos, Floyd Truetken).

**Lesser Nighthawk** *Chordeiles acutipennis* One was reported 21 Oct from w. Galveston Island (Jim Stevenson).

**Common Nighthawk** *Chordeiles minor* Lingering birds were noted 7 Nov at Friendswood, *Harris* (Mike Austin) and 12 Nov at High Island, *Galveston* (Anthony Hewetson). A nighthawk seen 23 Nov at Quintana, *Brazoria* was not identified to species (Ron Weeks).

**Buff-bellied Hummingbird** *Amazilia yucatanensis* The typical push of Nov birds was very evident this fall with birds noted from several UTC locations including the coastal migrant traps.

**Broad-tailed Hummingbird** *Selasphorus platycercus* Sight reports this fall included one 21 Oct at Friendswood, *Harris* (Mike Austin) and an immature male 12 Nov in west Houston, *Harris* (Jim Hinson).

**Allen's Hummingbird** *Selasphorus sasin* An adult male was reported 12 Nov in west Houston (Jim Hinson). This same yard has had Allen's in recent years.

**Ringed Kingfisher** *Ceryle torquata* One seen 6 Oct on w. Galveston Island constitutes just the 5<sup>th</sup> UTC record (Jim Stevenson).

**Red-headed Woodpecker** *Melanerpes erythrocephalus* An immature seen 19 Sep within earshot of the surf at Quintana, *Brazoria* was rare due to its coastal location (Ron Weeks).

**Ladder-backed Woodpecker** *Picoides scalaris* One was seen from at least 29 Oct-19 Nov at Lafitte's Cove, *Galveston* (David McDonald, Martha Brogdon et al). Another was seen 26 Nov in *Waller* where they may now be breeding (Jim Hinson, Adam Wood).

**Hairy Woodpecker** *Picoides villosus* One seen and heard at Armand Bayou Nature Center, *Harris* 21 Oct was well south of the normal range for the species (Laurie Foss).

**Olive-sided Flycatcher** *Contopus cooperi* One found 3 Aug on Pleasure Island, *Jefferson* was the 3<sup>rd</sup> earliest ever for the UTC (Joe Kennedy).

**Yellow-bellied Flycatcher** *Empidonax flaviventris* Birds found 5 Aug at Sabine Woods and Sea Rim SP, *Jefferson* and High Island, *Galveston* were the first migrants detected (Don Verser). An exceptional number of 30 was estimated 13 Sep at Quintana, *Brazoria* (John Arvin). One seen 17 Oct on w. Galveston Island (Jim Stevenson) and another in *Galveston* 18 Oct (Ted Eubanks, Steve Kelling) were late.

**Acadian Flycatcher** *Empidonax virescens* Three were found on 18 Oct in *Galveston* (Ted Eubanks, Steve Kelling). One seen and heard calling 19 Oct at High Island, *Galveston* tied the 2<sup>nd</sup> latest ever fall record (Don Verser).

**Alder Flycatcher** *Empidonax alnorum* One seen and heard 1 Oct at Sea Rim State Park, *Jefferson* is the 2<sup>nd</sup> latest ever for the UTC (Don Verser).

**Willow Flycatcher** *Empidonax traillii* This species had more sightings than usual with one bird called 25 Aug on the Katy Prairie, *Harris* (Jim Hinson), three birds 1 Sep at Brazos Bend SP, *Fort Bend* (Jim Stevenson), and one 10 Sep Quintana, *Brazoria* (John Arvin).

**Eastern Phoebe** *Sayornis phoebe* The first report was of 3 seen 25 Sep on Gau Road, *Chambers* (Joe Kennedy).

**Say's Phoebe** *Sayornis saya* One seen 29 Sep at the Mid-Coast NWR Parker Tract in eastern *Brazoria* constituted a rare fall record for the species (Don Verser, ph. Ed Barrios).

**Vermilion Flycatcher** *Pyrocephalus rubinus* Winter returnees were first seen 16 Sep at Port Bolivar, *Galveston* (Johnnie Greene et al), 23 Sep at Brazos Bend SP, *Fort Bend* (Adam Wood et al), and 24 Sep at Quintana, *Brazoria* (Ron Weeks, Johnnie Greene).

**Great Crested Flycatcher** *Myiarchus crinitus* One found 5 Aug at Sabine Woods, *Jefferson* was moving early (Don Verser). One seen 19 Nov on w. Galveston Island, *Galveston* was tardy (Jim Stevenson).

**Great Kiskadee** *Pitangus sulphuratus* One was found at Smith Point, *Chambers* on 15 Apr (John Arvin et al). Two of the long-staying but not recently seen Katy Prairie, *Harris* birds were refound on 8 Sep (Jim Hinson).

**Sulphur-bellied Flycatcher** *Myiodynastes luteiventris* One was reported from 10-11 Sep from Sabine Woods, *Jefferson* (John Haynes). What was likely this same bird was seen briefly on 9 Sep. Pending acceptance by the TBRC.

**Couch's Kingbird** *Tyrannus couchii* One of the Smith Point, *Chambers* pairs apparently returned as two birds were seen there 21 Aug - 28 Oct (John Arvin, Joe Kennedy).

**Western Kingbird** *Tyrannus verticalis* Lingered birds included 4 seen 12 Nov at Galveston Island SP, *Galveston* (Anthony Hewetson) and 2-3 seen 19-24 Nov at Indian Beach, *Galveston* (Jim Stevenson).

**Eastern Kingbird** *Tyrannus tyrannus* Two seen 6 Oct at Bryan Beach, *Brazoria* were late (Joe Kennedy).

**Bell's Vireo** *Vireo bellii* Fall Bell's have been more frequently detected in recent years. This fall singles were detected 6 Sep at Houston's Bear Creek Park, *Harris* (Jim Hinson, Howard Laidlaw) and 23 Sep at Quintana, *Brazoria* (Ron Weeks).

**Plumbeous Vireo** *Vireo plumbeus* One found 2 Sep at High Island's Boy Scout Woods, *Galveston* was just the 5<sup>th</sup> ever UTC record (Don Verser).

**Blue-headed Vireo** *Vireo solitarius* A report 4 birds from 14 Sep at Quintana, *Brazoria* tied the third earliest ever for the UTC (Bill Eley). Another bird photographed on two occasions was thought by many to be a Cassin's, but expert opinions were either inconclusive or felt it was a Blue-headed.

**Warbling Vireo** *Vireo gilvus* Two seen 21 Oct at Quintana, *Brazoria* were late (Adam Wood et al).

**Purple Martin** *Progne subis* One seen 18 Sep at Russ Pitman Park, *Harris* (Don Verser) and two seen 27 Sep at Smith Point, *Chambers* were on the late side (Joe Kennedy).

**Red-breasted Nuthatch** *Sitta Canadensis* One seen and heard 7 Nov on w. Galveston Island, *Galveston* represents a rare county record (Jim Stevenson).

**Brown-headed Nuthatch** *Sitta pusilla* One seen 17 Sep in south-central *Jefferson* was well south of the species normal range (Ray Jordan, Ken Sztraky). After a brief hiatus, birds once again were seen 24 Nov in northern *Harris* (Keith Kingdon).

**Brown Creeper** *Certhia americana* The first report was of one seen 21 Oct on w. Galveston Island (Jim Stevenson).

**Golden-crowned Kinglet** *Regulus satrapa* This species was first detected along the coast on 20 Oct at Quintana, *Brazoria* (Mark Bartosik, Ron Weeks) and Russ Pitman Park, *Harris* (Don Verser) with large numbers reported shortly thereafter. This is the 3<sup>rd</sup> earliest fall date for the UTC.

**Ruby-crowned Kinglet** *Regulus calendula* One found 13 Sep at Quintana, *Brazoria* was the 3<sup>rd</sup> earliest ever for the UTC (John Arvin).

**Swainson's Thrush** *Catharus ustulatus* Singles seen 24 Sep at Sabine Woods and Sea Rim SP, *Jefferson* were early (Don Verser).

**Wood Thrush** *Hylocichla mustelina* One seen 25 Nov at High Island, *Galveston* was late (Ted Eubanks).

**Clay-colored Robin** *Turdus grayi* The long-staying Lake Jackson, *Brazoria* bird was seen and heard into mid-August (Tom Morris, Barbara & Ellis Burkhardt).

**Gray Catbird** *Dumetella carolinensis* A 21 Oct estimate of 500 birds from Sabine Woods, *Jefferson* was impressive (John Whittle et al).

**Sage Thrasher** *Oreoscoptes montanus* This fall showed an unusual number of these birds east of normal. Singles were found 24 Oct near Smith Pt, *Chambers* (Heidi Trudell), 28 Oct *Brazoria* NWR, *Brazoria* (ph. Greg Lavaty), and 3 Nov at Sea Rim SP, *Jefferson* (Don Verser).

**Orange-crowned Warbler** *Vermivora celata* Early birds were found 31 Aug & 7 Sep in *Harris* (Drew Dickert) and 16 Sep on the Bolivar bird survey, *Galveston* (Johnnie Greene). The bird found 31 Aug was the 3<sup>rd</sup> earliest ever for the UTC and sounded likely a western race bird based on the strong yellowish tones.

**Black-throated Blue Warbler** *Dendroica caerulescens* It was a good year for the species with birds found 21 Sep at the HAS Dos Vacas Muertes, *Galveston* (Mike Austin), 15 Oct at Quintana, *Brazoria* (Jim Stevenson), 21 Oct at High Island, *Galveston* (Johnnie Greene) and two 25 Oct in the Sabine Pass area, *Jefferson* (Chris Runk).

**Yellow-rumped Warbler** *Dendroica coronata* One was seen 11 Oct on w. Galveston Island (Jim Stevenson).

**Blackburnian Warbler** *Dendroica fusca* One seen 10 Nov on w. Galveston Island was the 3<sup>rd</sup> latest ever for the UTC (Jim Stevenson).

**Yellow-throated Warbler** *Dendroica dominica* Lush birds were found 19 Nov High Island, *Galveston* (Don Verser), 23 Nov in Lake Jackson, *Brazoria* (Ron Weeks), and 28 Nov in Galveston (Mort Voller).

**Pine Warbler** *Dendroica pinus* One seen 26 Sep on w. Galveston Island was a very early migrant (Jim Stevenson).

**Blackpoll Warbler** *Dendroica striata* One reported 16 Oct from Sabine Woods, *Jefferson* constitutes a rare - and late - fall report for the species (Lynn Barber).

**Prothonotary Warbler** *Protonotaria citrea* One seen 12 Nov at San Bernard NWR, *Brazoria* was late (Ron Weeks).

**Swainson's Warbler** *Limothlypis swainsonii* One seen 13 Oct at Quintana, *Brazoria* was the 2<sup>nd</sup> latest ever for the UTC (Ron Weeks).

**Ovenbird** *Seiurus aurocapilla* One seen 25-26 Nov at High Island, *Galveston* was late (Ted Eubanks, John Mariani).

**Louisiana Waterthrush** *Seiurus motacilla* A well-described bird (calls and plumage) at Bear Creek Park, *Harris* on 18 Nov was the 2<sup>nd</sup> latest ever for the UTC (Drew Dickert).

**Mourning Warbler** *Oporornis philadelphia* One seen 20 Aug at Sabine Woods, *Jefferson* was the 4<sup>th</sup> earliest ever for the UTC (Don Verser). Another seen 13 Oct at Quintana, *Brazoria* was the 3<sup>rd</sup> latest ever fall record (Jim Stevenson).

**MacGillivray's Warbler** *Oporornis tolmiei* One seen 10 Sep at a Houston, *Harris* residence was the earliest ever fall record (Bob Honig). Interestingly, this is only the third fall record for the species in the UTC. However, several birds have been found during the winter and have likely been present during the fall.

**Hooded Warbler** *Wilsonia citrine* Birds found 5 Aug at Sabine Woods and Sea Rim SP, *Jefferson* and High Island, *Galveston* were the 3<sup>rd</sup> earliest ever fall migrants (Don Verser).

**Wilson's Warbler** *Wilsonia pusilla* An estimate of 20 birds on 13 Sep from Quintana, *Brazoria* was an exceptionally high (John Arvin).

**Canada Warbler** *Wilsonia canadensis* Singles seen 13 Oct at Smith Point, *Chambers* (Joe Kennedy) and Dos Vacas Muertes, *Galveston* (Don Verser) and 21 Oct on w. Galveston Island (Jim Stevenson et al) were late but another seen 12 Nov at Galveston Island SP was the 2<sup>nd</sup> latest ever for the UTC (Anthony Hewetson).

**Summer Tanager** *Piranga rubra* A banded bird seen 20 Oct at Bellaire's Russ Pitman Park, *Harris* was believed to be the same bird that was banded there during the winter of 2003-2004 and seen each winter since (Don Verser).

**Scarlet Tanager** *Piranga olivacea* A male seen 3 Nov at Sabine Woods, *Jefferson* was late (Don Verser).

**Western Tanager** *Piranga ludoviciana* 30 Sep Lorenz bird, Another was seen 25 Nov at High Island, *Galveston* (Ted Eubanks).

**Clay-colored Sparrow** *Spizella pallida* There were more than usual this fall with reports from *Harris* 21 Sep (John Berner), 29 Sep on w. Galveston Island (Jim Stevenson) and singles (same) seen 13 Oct-3 Nov at Quintana, *Brazoria* (Jim Stevenson, Don Verser, Ron Weeks).

**Lark Sparrow** *Chondestes grammacus* Good numbers were reported 30 Aug from *Brazoria/Galveston* (Jim Stevenson). Three were seen near the Smith Point Hawk Watch, *Chambers* on 1 Sep (Joe Kennedy).

**Savannah Sparrow** *Passerculus sandwichensis* Two found 29 Sep at Anahuac NWR, *Chambers* were early (Joe Kennedy).

**Grasshopper Sparrow** *Ammodramus savannarum* One found 16 Sep in Port Bolivar, *Galveston* was one of the earliest ever for the UTC (Cin-Ty Lee). A 1 Sep 2004 record from Bear Creek Park, *Harris* was thought by some to have been a local nester.

**Harris's Sparrow** *Zonotrichia querula* One seen 25 Nov at the Baytown Nature Center, *Harris* was one of few records east of Galveston Bay (Dwayne Liteer).

**McCown's Longspur** *Calcarius mccownii* One videotaped 28 Oct near the Quintana Jetty was just the 5<sup>th</sup> for the UTC and a first for *Brazoria* (Ron Weeks). It is also the earliest this species has ever been detected in fall, but fits the species arrival window for other regions of Texas.

**Lapland Longspur** *Calcarius lapponicus* One beautifully photographed 22 Oct at Bryan Beach was a first for *Brazoria* (ph. Michael Gray, Cecilia Riley).

**Black-headed Grosbeak** *Pheucticus melanocephalus* Surprising were two adult males were seen 24 Sep in *Harris* (Laura Cox). Another was seen 14-15 Oct at Quintana NBS, *Brazoria* (Mike Austin, Jim Stevenson).

**Indigo Bunting** *Passerina cyanea* Two found 20 Aug at Sabine Woods, *Jefferson* were early (Don Verser).

**Painted Bunting** *Passerina ciris* One that lingered through 16 Oct at Quintana, *Brazoria* was on the late side (Jim Stevenson, Ron Weeks et al).

**Rusty Blackbird** *Euphagus carolinus* The first reports were both on 21 Nov at Bear Creek Park, *Harris* (Johnnie Greene) where they are expected and at Brazos Bend SP, *Fort Bend* (Jim Stevenson) where they are not expected.

**Orchard Oriole** *Icterus spurius* One seen 13 Oct at Quintana, *Brazoria* was late (Jim Stevenson).

**Bullock's Oriole** *Icterus bullockii* The only report was of one 8 Sep on w. Galveston Island, *Galveston* (Jim Stevenson).

**American Goldfinch** *Carduelis tristis* An alternate plumage bird seen 23 Sep at Houston's Bear Creek Park, *Harris* was a new fall early for the UTC (Drew Dickert). Another seen 14 Oct at Armand Bayou Nature Center, *Harris* (Marilyn Kircus) was the 2<sup>nd</sup> earliest ever for the UTC. These early reports may simply be a result of poor historical record keeping of an expected species.
